### CME ACCREDITATION

5. Appreciate that the fair and equitable administration of the American Civil Justice System is dependant upon the availability of accurate, non-partisan, and honest radiologic expert witness testimony.
6. Define Phakomatoses
7. Discuss most common phakomatoses
8. Explain manifestations and features, genetics, clinical findings and imaging of phakomatoses
9. Discuss ways to help improve imaging diagnosis of phakomatoses
10. Gain new knowledge of CNS malformations by current case presentations with emphasis on the central nervous system
11. Gain new knowledge of complications which can occur in fetal CNS
12. Enhance knowledge in areas of examination of CNS and normal anatomy, congenital anomalies, etc.
